 2011 ANNUAL REVIEW OF MEDALLIONS

ORDER

IT APPEARING THAT on the 23rd day of August, 2011, a public hearing was held in the above-entitled matter, in compliance with the provisions of the Nevada Open Meeting Law, the Nevada Administrative Procedure Act, and Chapter 706 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC), at which time all interested parties appeared and were heard.

IT FURTHER APPEARING that the following parties moved to intervene:, A CAB, LLC; YELLOW/CHECKER/STAR CAB COMPANIES; NELLIS CAB COMPANY; DESERT CAB COMPANY; WESTERN CAB COMPANY; WHITTLESEA BLUE/HENDERSON TAXI; UNITED STEELWORKERS UNION; ITPE UNION; FRIAS HOLDING COMPANY; and LUCKY CAB COMPANY. Each of the moving parties was permitted to intervene.

IT FURTHER APPEARING that the Authority received proof regarding the circumstances affecting the interests of the taxicab industry, drivers and customers in Clark County, and that the Authority having duly considered the evidence, fully considered the law

and being fully advised in the premises makes its Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Taxicab Authority staff presented evidence regarding the most recent allocation of medallions in 2007, and arguments that the 2007 allocation was intended to cover a volume of up to 27,000,000 trips per year. Taxicab Authority staff also presented evidence and statistics regarding the number of trips per year for 2010 and the projected number of trips per year for 2011 is less than 27,000,000. Taxicab Authority staff recommended that no additional 24/7 medallions be allocated at the present time.
- 2. Intervenor Yellow/Checker/Star presented arguments and evidence regarding the number of trips per shift for the preceding months. Based upon the evidence presented to the Board, Yellow/Checker/Star recommended that no new 24/7 medallions be allocated, but that the Board allocate 5-7 new permanent medallions for the days of Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.
- 3. Intervenor A Cab, LLC, offered arguments regarding an increase in statistics affecting the taxicab industry, and asserted that an allocation of additional medallions would have little effect on A Cab, as A Cab is geographically restricted.
- 4. Intervenor Nellis Cab Company presented evidence and arguments showing a recent increase in revenue. Based upon the evidence and arguments presented, Nellis Cab Company recommended that the Board (1) extend the hours for weekend-only medallions to commence at 12:00 p.m. on Thursdays, and to end at 2:00 p.m. on Mondays; (2) that 6 new weekend only medallions be allocated immediately; and (3) that 6 new permanent 24/7 medallions be allocated at the rate of one new medallion per month beginning September 1, 2011 and continuing with one new 24/7 medallion per month each month through February 1, 2012.

- 6. Intervenor Western Cab Company offered evidence and argument in support of Nellis Cab Company's proposed allocation of taxicabs. Western Cab Company argued that a permanent allocation may reduce the need for frequent temporary allocations for special events.
- 7. Intervenor Whittlesea Blue/Henderson Taxi offered evidence and argument in support of Nellis Cab Company's proposed allocation of taxicabs. Whittlesea Blue/Henderson Taxi argued that revenue has increased and that blown shifts are no longer an issue. Whittlesea Blue/Henderson Taxi also offered arguments regarding the loss of market share to other forms of transportation.
- 8. Intervenors ITPE Union and United Steelworkers Union jointly offered evidence and argument regarding visitor volume to Las Vegas and current industry statistics being below the levels of the most recent allocation in 2007, as well as the impact of additional allocations on taxicab drivers. ITPE Union and United Steelworkers Union argued that no additional allocations should be made.
- 9. Intervenor Lucky Cab Company offered evidence and arguments in support of Nellis Cab Company's proposed allocation of medallions. Lucky Cab Company advised the Board that an additional allocation would create more jobs in the taxicab industry.
- 10. Intervenor Frias Holding Company offered evidence and arguments in support of an additional allocation of medallions. Frias offered video evidence showing an empty cab stand at the Mandalay Bay. Dr. Stephen Brown testified on behalf of Frias Holding Company and offered evidence to the Board regarding economic indicators and the vitality of the hospitality and tourism industry in Clark County. John Hickman testified regarding the current performance of the Frias Companies as well as statistics and observations from the industry supporting an increase in medallions. Mark James testified that the taxicab industry's market

- share is shrinking. Based upon these arguments and evidence, Frias Holding Company recommended that 20 new 24/7 medallions be allocated by the Board.
 - 11. Members of the public testified on this issue during the public comment periods.
 - 12. If any of the foregoing findings of fact is more properly deemed a conclusion of law, it may be so construed.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. This matter was held in accordance with applicable Nevada Revised Statutes.
- 2. The hearing conducted by the Board in this matter satisfies the requirement that the Taxicab Authority shall review annually the existing allocation of taxicabs pursuant to NRS 706.8824(6)(a).
- 3. When reviewing the allocation of medallions, the Taxicab Authority considers the interests, welfare, convenience, necessity and well-being of the customers of taxicabs.
- 4. Conditions within the Taxicab industry warrant an additional allocation of both 24/7 medallions and weekend medallions as proposed by Nellis Cab Company.
- 5. Conditions within the Taxicab industry also warrant an extension of the hours affecting the existing weekend medallions as proposed by Nellis Cab Company.
- 6. The area to be affected by the Order is Clark County, Nevada.
- 7. The interests, welfare, convenience, necessity and well being of the customers of taxicabs are better served by this Order.
- 8. If any of the foregoing conclusions is more appropriately construed a finding of fact, it may be so construed.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the hours of operation for the existing time-restricted weekend medallions (which are the medallions indicated by a black plate with white lettering and white border) be extended from their current operating restrictions of Fridays at 2:00 p.m.

1	to Sundays 2:00 p.m., to the new time-restrictions proposed by Nellis Cab Company of
2	Thursdays at 12:00 p.m. (noon) to Mondays at 2:00 p.m.;
3	IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that each certificate holder shall be granted six (6)
4	additional time-restricted weekend medallions which may likewise be operated from
5	Thursdays at 12:00 p.m. (noon) to Mondays at 2:00 p.m.;
6	IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that each certificate holder shall be granted a total of six
7	(6) additional 24/7 medallions to be allocated as follows:
8	- one (1) new medallion effective September 1, 2011;
9	- one (1) new medallion effective October 1, 2011;
10	- one (1) new medallion effective November 1, 2011;
11	- one (1) new medallion effective December 1, 2011;
12	- one (1) new medallion effective January 1, 2012; and
13	- one (1) new medallion effective February 1, 2012.
